
# **Standard Operating Procedure for panoramas**

# \*\*Login: \*\*

- a. Surf to https://panoramas.itg.be/
- b. You will be presented with a login screen. You can log in using either your email address or your ITM account.

c. Click the "Login" button.



#### \*\*Create a new panorama: \*\*


a. In the Panorama dashboard, locate and select the "New panorama" option.



# \*\*Name the panorama: \*\*

a. After creating a new panorama, click on the crayon icon to set a name for your panorama.

c. If desired, you can also include additional data or information related to the panorama.



# \*\*Enter a central symptom: \*\*

- a. In the newly created panorama, locate the central symptom box in yellow.
- b. Double click on the yellow node and fill in the central symptom.




# \*\*Adjust inner circle radius: \*\*

a. If necessary, you can adjust the inner circle radius to fit all your inner circle diseases.



# \*\*Add inner circle diseases: \*\*

- a. Select 'Inner circle disease' under elements and press add.
- b. Move the blue node to the desired place and double-click on it.
- c. Fill in the disease in the provided text box.




#### \*\*Add excluders or includers: \*\*

- a. If required, you can add excluders or includers.
- b. For excluders, use the red elements or boxes. For includers, use the green boxes.

#### \*\*Group multiple diseases with arcs: \*\*

If you have multiple diseases with a common symptom, consider adding arcs.

- a. For arcs you select the option 'ADD ARC'.
- b. Select three points on the panorama regarding the desired place and the curve of the arc.
- c. Select a color for your arc.

d. Now add a box 'Shared finding', fill in the common symptom and move the node near the arc. Change the background color as wanted.

# \*\*Group multiple diseases with segments: \*\*

If you have multiple diseases with a common symptom, consider adding segments.

- a. For segments you select the option 'ADD SEGMENT'.
- b. Drag the bar so it covers the diseases that present with this symptom.

(Tip: if your segment shouldn't start from three o'clock, you can add an invisible segment first and then add another colored segment.)

Shared finding

- c. Select a color for your segment.
- d. Now add a box 'Shared finding', fill in the common symptom and move the node near the segment. Change the background color as wanted.




Figure 1: An example of an arc (green) and a segment (brown) with both a 'Shared finding' node

#### \*\*Add Outer circle diseases: \*\*

For diagnoses that belong to the outer circle, follow the same process as for inner circle diseases, but without excluders or includers.

#### \*\*Delete a node. \*\*



Delete any node by double clicking on the box you want deleted and select 'DELETE NODE'

# \*\*Don't forget to save the panorama regularly. \*\*

In the upper right corner, you can find a save icon.



## \*\*Leaving the panorama. \*\*

After saving click to leave the panorama.



# \*\*Reenter the panorama. \*\*

a. For visualization of the panorama without editing, just click on the name of the panorama.



b. You can also edit the panorama after saving through clicking the crayon i



# \*\* Other features in the right upper corner. \*\*

- Click this icon to see or hide all includers and excluders. Sometimes you need to save, leave, and reenter your panorama first.
- Click this icon to save your panorama as an image.
- Click this icon to invite other colleagues to work in this panorama.
